

The Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit

We now conclude last week's article on the Holy Spirit with the Gifts that He sends.

In his great love for us, the Holy Spirit has not only endowed us with His wonderful gift of sanctifying grace, by which we live in God, and He lives in us; but He has also planted into our heart seven Gifts, in which He hid the possibilities of the very highest sanctity. Through them the soul is made as it were a musical instrument, worthy that the hands of God should play upon it, and out of which He can evoke such melodies of holiness. He is ever varying the music as the rapid touch of His divine hand flies over the many keys of our heart by means of His actual impulses, and according to the needs of our spiritual life.

As Venerable Fulton J. Sheen said, "These gifts are special supernatural faculties and capabilities given the soul whereby it may more easily and securely follow His inspirations and impulses. They are so powerful, that they make us ready, supple and docile to His inspirations."

Knowledge. Knowledge illuminates intelligence by making it aware of God in the universe. It sharpens human vision by focusing the mind on the splendor of God in created things, and it enables us to distinguish the true from the false, and good from evil. Knowledge is in sharp contrast to ignorance which is blind to God's presence. Knowledge is a refinement of the virtue of Faith.

Understanding. This Gift further perfects human intelligence by directing it toward divinely revealed truth. It enables the intellect to grasp the truths of faith and the mysteries of religion according the measure of human intelligence, and to incorporate them into the processes of daily thinking. Understanding gives us an appreciation of the value of the supernatural. It is opposed to dullness

exercises a moderation influence on the mind, giving it keenness, clarity and serenity in judgment. It is closely related to the moral virtue, Prudence, since it enables a person to apply the truths and laws of faith to conduct. Rashness is opposed to Counsel.

Fortitude. Strengthens the will in resisting temptation and it fortifies a person against discouragement and despair by alerting those who enjoy it to the nearness of God. This Gift disposes the soul to resist the appeal of creature comforts. It is an extension of the moral virtue of the same name. It counteracts cowardice.

Piety. Piety regulates the emotional side of human nature by keeping it in tune with a love for God. It fires the heart of a man with a warm and filial love for God which makes him delight in offering worship and service to God. Piety is closely allied to the moral virtue of Temperance; it is opposed to coldness of heart toward God.

Fear of the Lord. This Gift perfects the will by keeping in reverent toward God and fearful of offending Him because of the love we bear Him. This gift springs from a pure love of God and a knowledge of His justice. It is closely related to Justice, and it is opposed to irreverence.

This sums up the Gifts of the Holy Spirit. God plants the seeds of these gifts in our souls by Grace—especially by the Grace of Baptism and Confirmation. If they are properly cultivated they will flower into great spiritual ornaments of supernatural living—such as seen in the great splendor of the lives of the Saints. God bless.
