Here we go! In the days of June, we received our building permit from the City of New Orleans, so our long-awaited restoration of St Stephen Church has begun. You may have noticed when you came to church this week-end that there is equipment in the courtyard. The first step is to construct scaffolding along the school (courtyard) side of the building, where work will begin. The non-ADA compliant ramp will be demolished and replaced with a temporary rap leading to the front porch until the new one is constructed.

While parish staff are working closely with Donahue-Favret Contractors to minimize disruption, our project will require a little patience from parishioners and staff. We must provide space for materials and a small foreman's office onsite; this will come at the expense of a few parking-spaces in our already small parking-lot. Access to the parking-lot may be limited to one driveway.

Keep those payments coming! *Many* thanks to all who have pledged in support of the Campaign for the Restoration of St Stephen's. Most people have either set up on-line payments or have been making regular cash/check payments on pledges. About 10% of you have not yet started payments. If you want to verify that you have pledged, need assistance setting up a payment schedule, or have any other questions regarding donations to the Campaign or the parish, please contact me in the rectory office.

Remember that every dollar that we collect early on reduces the overall interest cost on the project.

How Old Is Your Church?
